

Recurring series - 6 yo (1st grade) and up

Perfect for the after-school programs and gathering creative souls.

Format:

In person (NY / NJ*)
10 -12 sessions | 60 min each |
Minimum 4, max 10 participants - mixed grades

Objective: Social Emotional Learning (SEL), learning the techniques, complete a knitted item to keep. No screen

Included:

- A weekly 1-hour group class for a full trimester.
- Personalized guidance as required.
- Material and supplies for the project.
- Project to be taken home
- Guidance on personal projects upon request

Quiet time activity supporting creativity, fine motor skills practice, textile awareness and sustainability
